Why Run a Social Road Rally?

Minimize cost to the Region

They only cost \$4.50 a car with a cap of \$45 no matter how many cars you have.

Don't need a lot of staff

Helps the Region train a Road Rally staff for future events.

Helps bring new members to the Region (requires a driver and a navigator)

Helps bring publicity to your Region

Your Social Road Rally Team

Rally Organizer – Interface with everyone

Rally Master – Select the route, get clues, Route Instructions

Safety Steward – Sign SCCA RoadRally Safety Inspection

Registrar

Lead/Chase Cars

Minimum of 2 people



How to Initiate a Social Road Rally

- 1. Pick a Theme** --This helps when it comes to publicity.
 - A. “Moontower” for anniversary of first walk on the moon
 - B. “Ghost Town” for Halloween
 - C. Historical – “Come and Take It” spring wild flower rally
- 2. Pick an approximate route** – Lay out on a rough map, details later.
- 3. Choose a date** – Schedule around local region events.
 - A. Circuit of the Americas (COTA), Cars and Coffee, race events
 - B. TU football, SWT football,
 - C. Soccer, Pro, TU and SWT

Initiating a Social Road Rally

1. **Select a start time –**
 - A. Not too early unless it is a breakfast run.
 - B. Not too late unless so you can finish before dark.
 - C. We normally shoot for a late lunch finish
 - a. Start about 11:00 AM
 - b. finish about 2:00 PM.
2. **Choose a Starting Point** – Need a big parking lot, facilities, and shade.
3. **Choose a Finish Point** – Need access to food or drinks and socializing.
4. **Give your Board an estimated budget and Flyer**

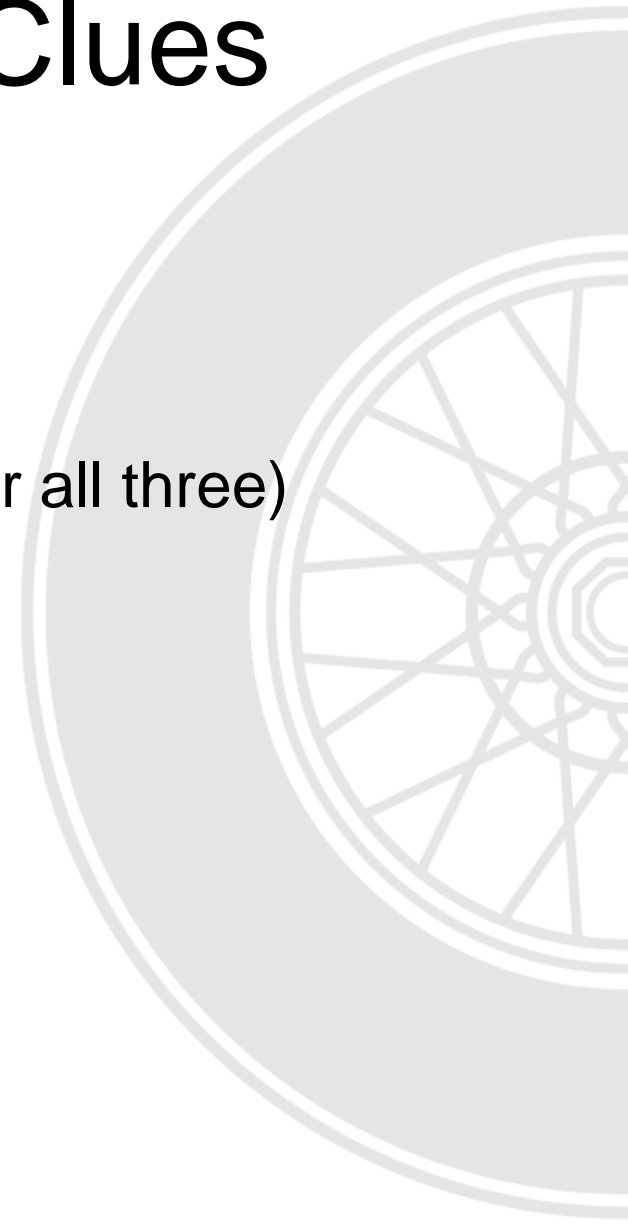

SCCA RoadRally Interesting Facts Along the Way

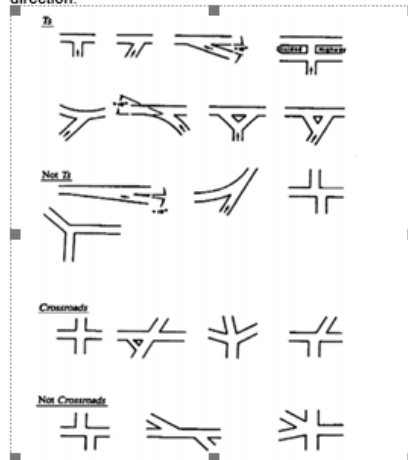


SCCA RoadRally General Instructions

Road Instruction Conventions

The Principal Road is the obvious continuation of the road on which you are traveling. If you are to leave the principal road, or the Principal Road is not obvious, you will be given a route instruction. The Principal Road may be defined by road surface, curve arrows, center lines, stop signs, yield signs etc.

These diagrams of intersections typically encountered on SCCA Road Rallies are to be interpreted as illustrated. With the exception of the first two "Not Crossroads" illustrations, each of the road configurations illustrated here is to be considered to be a single intersection when approached from any direction.



Word Capitalization Rules

Word in CAPS is part of a sign or building name and must be recorded in kind.

Example: "WELCOME TO AUSTIN, TEXAS"

Example: "THOROUGHbred LANE"

Word in lower case represents an object, color, description, adjective or noun

Example: profile of a cowboy on his knees, windmill, the color red

Glossary:

Acute	Turn in the indicated direction from 100° to 179°
ARCH	Look for wording or figures on the arch over a driveway entrance.
At	"In the vicinity of" for actions that direct a course of travel; "even with" for other actions, including speed changes(CAST), mileage, pauses, etc.
Bear	A turn in the direction indicated from 10 to 80 degrees.
Before	In sight of and prior to the referenced navigational aid.
Blinker	A warning signal at an intersection or rail road crossing which the contestant is obliged to obey. The blinker consists of a light or lights, usually red or yellow, operating in a fixed
