5			Prior to a major flood on the Colorado River in 1869, the railroad was going to run between Bastrop and Webberville. Following the flood, the route was moved north to include Elgin, Manor, and McDade bypassing Perryville, Young's Settlement and Hogeye						
6	0.1	10.4	Turn left or north on Texas State Highway 95 and go one block to North Main Street.

7	1.2	11.6	Turn right on North Main Street and go through downtown Elgin and over the railroad tracks to Brenham Street. East Brenham Street will be to your left and West Brenham Street will be to your right.

8			McDade was named for James W. McDade, a major stockholder in the Houston and Texas Central Railroad in 1869. This railroad began as the Galveston and Red River Railway in 1852 with its start in Houston. By 1862 it had track to Millican but construction was interrupted by the Civil War. In 1867 construction resumed as the Washington County Railroad but in 1868 was renamed the Houston and Texas Central. In 1871 the line extension reached Austin.							
9	5.1	17.0	<b>Veer right off of West Brenham Street onto Old McDade Road which becomes County Road 106. Continue on Country Road 106 until it crosses Farm to Market road 696.</b>

Of her 35 movies, the two to remember tonight are "The Underworld Story" and "Revenge of the Zombies" (1943).

13			As you approach Texas State Highway 95 you will notice Camp Swift on your right. This camp was originally built in January 1942 and was one of the largest training camps in Texas. Over 300,000 GIs trained here in World War II including nurses who trained under battlefield conditions.. It also had over 10,000 German Prisoners of War encamped here.

(Impact road to the right is a dirt road and will be gated with a sign saying it is National Guard Property and to Keep Out.) Sayers Road is also called County Road 157.</b>							
14			The portion of Texas State Highway 95 from Texas State Highway 71 (Bastrop) to US highway 290 (Elgin) has been designated as part of the 10th Mountain Division Memorial Highway. The 10th Mountain Division has been the US Army's only Alpine Division in which troops are specifically trained for operation in mountains and snow. The unit was first created in 1943 but before it was sent to Italy, it was sent to Camp Swift for hot weather training. The troops said that the marches from Camp Swift were harder on them then the high altitude cold weather training that they underwent in Colorado. The Germans considered the 10th one of the top US divisions in Italy.

15			Sayersville was originally called Sayers when it was founded in 1886 along the Missouri,, Kansas, and Texas (MKT or Katy) railroad line from Taylor to Bastrop. The name was changed to Sayersville when the post office was established here in 1889. From 1911 until a fire closed the mine in 1928 an underground lignite mine operated for the railroad.

22			This old auto bridge is over Wilbarger Creek, named in honor of Josiah P. Wilbarger. Josiah, born in Kentucky, wed in Missouri, and came to Texas in 1827. He was an early member of Stephen F Austin's colony where he taught school and surveyed. In August 1833 his four man surveying party was attacked in this area by Comanches. Josiah was scalped and left for dead. He survived and lived another 12 years before dying from hitting his head on his roof in 1845. Wilbarger County on the Red River is also named in his honor.

28			Littig, Texas was established in 1883 on the Southern Pacific Railway on land donated by Jackson Morrow, a former slave. The town was named for A. B. Littig, former general division agent of the Houston and Texas Central Railway. By 1887 it had a depot, locomotive water tank, church and school. The post office was opened two years later. in 1900 the community had 168 residents. This community, like Manda, Kimbro, and McDade, began to decline in the 1930s with the spread of automobile transportation.
