1	0.5	0.0	Turn right out of the Parking lot onto West 51st Street. Travel east to Avenue G. There may not be a street sign for Ave G so it was one block after Ave F.					
1			Lamar Boulevard is named for the second President of the Republic of Texas, Mirabeau B. Lamar.					
2	0.6	0.6	Turn right off of West 51st onto Avenue G and go to East 45th Street

3	0.1	0.7	Turn Right off of Avenue G onto East 45th Street and go to Speedway					
3			Speedway was named by real estate developer Monroe Shipe. It was a broad, graded gravel road that ran from the Capitol to the racetrack in Hyde Park.					
4	0.4	1.0	Turn left off of Speedway and go to 41st Street.					
4			Speedway was originally the extension of Congress Ave north of the Capitol. Current maps now extend Congress all the way to MLK Jr Street. The portion of Speedway through the University campus has been closed to traffic and Speedway resumes its original route about 24th street up to 31st Street. At 31st Street it jogs west three blocks and then resumes its northward course to finally end north of 49th Street at the Archery Field.					
5	0.3	1.0	The First Moontower is at 41st and Speedway. Continue on Speedway and to West 38th Street.					
5								
6	0.7	1.7	Turn Left off of Speedway onto West 38th Street and continue to Red River. As you approach Red River, 38 1/2 Street curves to the left for a stop light on Red River. Stay straight on 38th Street to Red River.

7	0.7	2.4	Turn Right off of West 38th Street onto Red River and follow that road to E. Dean Keeton.					

7			When the City of Austin was first laid out in 1839, the north south streets starting with Rio Grande and ending in Red River were named after the rivers of Texas as they entered the Gulf of Mexico.
8	0.4	2.8	Turn left off of Red River onto East Dean Keeton Street. Pass under I-35 to Lafayette Ave.
8			Originally, I-35, or the Inter-regional as it was known back then, was following East Avenue which was the original eastern city limit of Austin.
9	0.1	2.9	Turn Right off of East Dean Keeton onto Lafayette Ave and the few yards to go to Manor Road
9			W. Page Keeton was Dean of the University of Texas at Austin Law School from 1949 until 1974. He is credited with assembling a faculty that ranked among the best in the United States.
9			James Manor of Tennessee followed Sam Houston to Texas and then settled in the Austin area after the Texas Revolution.
10	0.3	3.2	Dogleg Left off Lafayette Ave onto Chicon and go to MLK Blvd. The Second Moontower is at the corner of Chicon and Martin Luther King Blvd.
10			MLK was renamed for Martin Luther King Jr on 4 April 1968 but at that time it only affected that portion of the road from I-35 east. The political resistance to naming all of 19st after Martin Luther King Jr was not overcome until June of 1976. When the original city of Austin was laid out in 1839 by Edwin Waller (Waller Creek was named after him) the street was known as Magnolia.
11	0.4	3.6	Continue South (straight) on Chicon to 13th Street.
11			
12	0.2	3.8	Turn Left off Chicon onto 13th Street. The Third Moontower is at the corner of 13th and Coleto Street.
12			The original name of 13th Street was Peach Street.
13	0.1	3.9	Turn Right off 13th Street onto Coleto Street and go to 12th Street. Beware that the Coleto Street sign is partially covered by tree branches.
13			

14	0.3	4.2	Turn Right off Coleta Street onto 12th Street and go two streets past Chicon to Leona Street.
14			The original name of 12th was College Avenue with more details later.
15	0.2	4.4	Turn Left off of 12th Street onto Leona Street. The Fourth Moontower is at Pennsylvania Avenue and Leona Street.
15			Hightower Theodore Kealing was born a slave in Waco in either 1859 or 1860. He was among the first generation of blacks to attend schools established for the education of blacks during Reconstruction. After graduating high school, he attended Tabor College to join the faculty of Paul Quinn College in Waco where he became principal. In 1883 he moved to Austin where became involved with teaching, journalism, and the American Methodist Episcopal Church. He was appointed President of Western University in Quindaro, Kansas where he died in 1918. He is buried in Waco. Keating Middle School opened in 1930 near where he worked in Austin.
16	0.1	4.5	Turn Left off of Leona Street onto Pennsylvania and go one block to Salina Street.
16			
17	0.1	4.6	Turn Right off of Pennsylvania onto Salina Street and go to Rosewood Avenue.
17			
18	0.4	5.0	Turn Right off of Salina Street onto Rosewood Ave.
18			
19	0.5	5.5	Turn right off of Rosewood Ave onto 11th street and go to Lydia Street. The Fifth Moontower is at the corner of 11st Street and Lydia Street.
19			The original name for 11th Street was Mosquite Street. No, I didn't misspell it.
20	0.3	5.8	Turn Left off of 11th Street onto Lydia Street and go to 7th Street.
20			
21	0.4	6.2	Turn Left off of Lydia Street onto 7th Street and go to Chicon Street.
21			The original name for 7th Street was Bois de Arc, a local tree that was often used by the Indians for making their bows and arrows.

22	0.5	6.7	Turn right on Chicon and continue across East Cesar Chavez Street to Canterbury Street which is the second street past East Cesar Chavez Street.						
22									
23	0.1	6.8	Turn Left off Chicon onto Canterbury Street and go one block to Lynn Street. The Sixth Moontower is at the corner of Canterbury Street and Lynn Street.						
23									
24	0.1	6.9	Turn Right on Lynn Street and go to Holly Street.						
24									
25	0.8	7.7	Turn right off of Lynn Street onto Holly Street. Holly Street will pass under Interstate 35. When you reach the southbound access road for Interstate 35 turn left.						
25									
26	1.2	8.9	Using the southbound access road for Interstate 35, cross the Colorado River (Lady Bird Lake), East Riverside Drive and continue to Woodland Avenue.						
26			Longhorn Dam, completed in 1960, was built to create a cooling water pond for the proposed Holly Street Power Plant. The resulting lake went unnamed and the Texas Highway Department labeled it "Town Lake". In 2007 the City of Austin renamed the lake "Lake Lady Bird" after the wife of President Lyndon B Johnson who was known as "Lady Bird". The lake is not part of the Highland Lake chain which was built by the Lower Colorado River Authority for flood control and electrical generation.						
27	0.5	9.4	Turn Right onto Woodland Avenue. Drive slowly as there are several speed bumps on this road. When you cross a creek after Sunset Lane you are at East Side Drive.						
27									
28	0.3	9.7	Turn Left off of Woodland Avenue onto East Side Drive. Drive slowly as there are several speed bumps on this road. The Seventh Moontower is at the corner of East Side Drive and Leland Street.

29	0.1	9.8	Continue South on East Side Drive to East Live Oak Drive. Drive slowly as there are several speed bumps on this road.								
29			Don't be confused by the Live Oak name which was the original name of 2nd Street. When the city of Austin was laid out in 1839, nothing existed south of the river. The river the street name was recycled. In the late 1870s the tree name designations for the east west streets were replaced with the current numbered street system.								
30	0.7	10.5	Turn Right on East Live Oak Drive for more speed bumps. You will Dogleg Left at Congress Avenue and continue on West Live Oak Drive to South First Street.								
30			The South Side of Austin recycled the numbered street names from 1st through seventh. Remember that until the 1990 South Austin was considered nothing but a "Bad Trip".								
31	0.4	10.9	Turn Right on South First Street. The Eight Moontower is at the corner of South First Street and West Monroe Street.								
31			Monroe was one of John Milton Swisher's sons. Swisher founded the "Swisher Addition" to South Austin in 1877. Other Swisher children who had streets named after them include Annie, Elizabeth, James, Milton, Newton, Nellie, Nickerson, and Stacy								
32	0.7	11.6	Continue North on South First Street to Barton Springs Road								
32			William Barton, (1782-1840) was called the "Daniel Boone of Texas. He was born in South Carolina but moved to Kentucky and Alabama before coming to Texas in Stephen Austin's second colony. He was give a head right in Bastrop County but when neighbors moved in 10 miles away he moved to the area of Waterloo, Texas where he settled on Barton Creek.								
33	1.2	12.8	Turn Left on Barton Springs Road. Cross Lamar Blvd and Barton Creek and you will see the Ninth Moontower on your left.								

39			West Lynn derives it name from the fact that it was the "west line" of its subdivision.							
39			Nau's Enfield Drug was founded in 1951. The area to the west of Nau's is the original community of Clarksville. This community was between 10th and 12th streets and from West Lynn to the Missouri Pacific Railway. It was a poorer section of town that furnished the domestic help for the wealthier homes along Windsor Road .							
40	0.3	16.6	Turn Left on 12th Street and the 10th Moontower is at the corner of 12th and Blanco Street/Windsor Road. Blanco Street goes to the right off of 12th Street but going to the left it is Windsor Road. More speed bumps on 12th Street.							
40			As you approach 19th street, Shoal Creek gets closer to Lamar and the undeveloped land on both sides of the creek is part of Pease Park, named after former Governor Elisha M. Pease who came to Texas in 1835. He was active in the Texas independence movement and was secretary to several of the independence conventions. He was elected governor in 1853 and 1855. After the Civil War, in which he supported the Union, he was appointed Governor by General Philip H Sheridan in 1867 bur resigned in 1869 having alienated both unionists and Confederates. His grand home, Woodlawn, built in 1853, is at 9 Niles Road, just off Enfield.							
41	0.2	16.8	Turn Left off of 12th Street onto Windsor Road and go to Enfield.							
41										
42	0.6	17.4	Turn Right on Enfield Road but stay out of the right lane so you can cross over Lamar on the 15th Street bridge. Continue on 15th Street to San Antonio Street The Eleventh Moontower is at the corner of West 15th and San Antonio Street							
42										
43	0.2	17.6	Turn Right on San Antonio Street and continue to West 12th Street.							
43										
44	0.1	17.7	Turn Right on West 12th Street and continue to Rio Grande Street. The Twelfth Moontower is at the corner of West 12th Street and Rio Grande Street.
